MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

As we continue thinking about silence and solitude, let's focus on some practical benefits of solitude and silence.

First, they break the power of a hurried life. Willard writes, "The person who is capable of doing nothing might be capable of refraining from doing the wrong thing. And then perhaps he or she would be better able to do the right thing." Practicing silence and solitude positions us to become acutely aware of the things we are doing and what we are about to do.

Second, they help renew our souls. In the 1500's, Francis de Sales wrote, "There is no clock, no matter how good it may be, that doesn't need resetting and rewinding twice a day, once in the morning and once in the evening. In addition, at least once a year it must be taken apart to remove the dirt clogging it, straighten out bent parts, and repair those worn out. In like manner, every morning and evening a man who really takes care of his heart must rewind it for God's service . . . Moreover, he must often reflect on his condition, in order to reform and improve it.

Finally, at least once a year he must take it apart and examine every piece in detail, that is every affection and passion, in order to repair whatever defects there may be."

The Bible speaks of this as well in Zephaniah 1:7, Psalm 62:5-6, and Isaiah 30:15.
